Principal's Report: Allen Wardlaw

- School Start Time forums are beginning
 - o Tomorrow at South HS school start time forum from 6-7 pm

- March 23 having a staffing event; vacancies include positions for a counselor, Spanish teacher, SPED teacher, Language Arts teacher, and Art teacher
- March 24 USS Alaska submarine crew is visiting the NROTC classroom at 10 am

- March 30 The German ambassador to the United States is presenting SHS a certificate for language achievement at 8 am
 - o SHS teaches to a proficiency level that can allow some students to go to college in Germany

Funds Request:

- Katie Harter Science Department
 - Request for two microscope eye-piece cameras to help teach students to use microscopes and four classroom calculators to support chemistry students who cannot afford their own
 - o Request for \$500
 - ➤ Liesl motions to approve \$500. Robin seconds. Approved.
- Lauren Hess Robotics Club
 - o Funds would be used to purchase a starter Robotics kit so we can start a robotics club at SHS
 - o Need the minimum of a starter kit to compete
 - West HS willing to purchase under their club to receive a 25% discount so total cost would be \$674.73 (normally \$894.95)
 - Angela motions to approve \$675.00. Robin seconds. Approved.
- Teri Jensen Fine Arts Department
 - Two requests
 - o Request for two updated digital cameras for the photography class
 - o Many of the current cameras are broken and outdated
 - o Total cost \$1098.00
 - ➤ Liesl motions to approve \$1100 Allen seconds. Approved
 - Request for five tripods
 - o Do not have enough tripods and some are broken
 - o Total cost \$490.45
 - ➤ Chris motions to approve \$500. Allen seconds. Approved.
- SHS Hockey Booster Club
 - o Request to reimburse Hockey Booster Club for jerseys used during Partner's Club event
 - o Request not signed; no representative available to ask questions

- Willow explains this is a Service tradition, a special night where the hockey team is paired
 with Partner's Club student and plays a game with that individual's name on their jersey. The
 jerseys are then auctioned and the proceeds go to the Partner's Club.
- o Last request for funds was in 2017
- o Coach Carter answered questions electronically through Mr. Lubken
- o Total cost is \$2605.00
- ➤ Willow motions to approve \$2605. Robin seconds. Approved.

- Request to purchase essential products and decorations/supplies for a breastfeeding room that can be used by staff and guests
- o Total cost is \$500
- ➤ Chris motions to approve \$500. Amber Seconds. Approved.

 - \circ Request is for \$75 per person = \$1500
 - o Student's are already paying \$800 to go
 - o Entry fee was donated; other fees are covered through other means
 - Would also help students struggling to pay the \$800
 - ➤ Willow motions to approve \$1500. Angela seconds. Approved.
