Treasurer's Report – Ron Bates

- Income last month \$6,639 Expenses \$7,244
- Income year to date \$59,475 Expenses \$84,733
- Current balances: Checking \$3,456 Savings \$49,855

Principal's Report – John Gaskins

- The principal's position was announced on Monday.
- Looking at remaining projects using up the FF&E funds from construction projects. This will include the drinking fountains and gym sound system. FF&E = Fixtures, Furniture and Equipment.
- AP testing is ongoing in the library.
- Booster clubs are able to use the turf scoreboard and announce games but need to be trained.

- Showed the board the new baseball uniforms which are reversible and well-liked by the team.

Cougar Cache Report – Laura Romberg
